**ANZ Home Loan Introducer Program** by Tamaku McLeod and Vicki Draper

Branch is open 7 days a week. This branch also offers learning opportunities for school students prior to opening time, showing students the functioning of a branch. ANZ offers is a strong supporter of education and offers educational staff and schools competitive rates on their products.

The program involves the P&C as a community group entering into an agreement with ANZ to refer prospective customers for qualifying ANZ home loans. Introducers are paid a 'one off' upfront 0.3% commission for every customer they introduce who applies for and draws down a qualifying ANZ loan. eg. \$500,000 loan = \$1,500 commission. The program is open for any community or staff member to apply.

**How it works** - Home loan applicants obtain a **signed referral form** specific to Kent St SHS P&C prior to applying for the loan. They take the form with them to their local ANZ branch.

ANZ will provide marketing information for us to use to promote the program. There are no fees or obvious disadvantages for the P&C to promote this program, and after discussion all agreed to pursue it. P&C must sign an application to begin, requiring two signatories – (Raelene Perselo and John Nicol) Kath to organise for signing of Application form.

### **Principal's Report - P&C Meeting held on Tuesday 3 November 2015**

1. **WACE Exams** – Allan Blagaich, CEO of the School Curriculum and Standards Authority, visited Kent Street on Monday to officially launch the start of the WACE exams. Our students spoke eloquently to the media and were fine ambassadors for the school. We wish them all every success in this final set of exams. Our Year 12 leavers' night is scheduled to take place on Friday 27 November in our school gymnasium.
2. **Fashion Showcase** – The Fashion and Design students strutted their stuff on the catwalk at the Lifestreams Church in Como last Wednesday night. They did an excellent job of showcasing their talents – both as designers and models of their fine creations. Thanks are extended to the Fashion and Design staff who ensure that this event ran smoothly and a special thanks go to the students from outside the F&D team who support by undertaking master of ceremony duties, performing musical interludes, assisting with the lighting and sound and so on. They are a real credit to the school.

We will be actively engaging with the entire school community – students, parents and staff – to ensure that the framework aligns to the identified needs of Kent Street in particular. We hope that you will be happy to share your perspective when we call upon you.

4. **New crosswalk on Berwick Street** – The crossing attendant commenced this term and we are facing some teething problems in the mornings when students alight from the bus some 100 metres further down the road and are not walking up to the corner to cross at the direction of the attendant. It would be appreciated if parents could impress upon their children the importance of making good use of this new facility put in place to keep them safe. It is a very busy road.
5. **Perimeter fencing** – Information has been distributed to the local community and the map outlining the intended perimeter fence is available upon request at the front office. We welcome feedback and suggestions. We hope that the fencing might be installed during the summer holiday period.
6. **Year 11s** – The Year 11 exams commence on Monday 9 November. Those students with no exams are permitted to stay home for the duration of exams, however, if they know that they have outstanding work it is highly advisable that they negotiate with their teachers about coming to school – especially if the tasks are practical tasks which require access to school facilities. Exams finish on Tuesday 17 November and ALL YEAR 11s are expected to return until 4 December – the end of week 8. Many Learning Areas commence the 2016 curriculum in these closing weeks and students who stay away disadvantage themselves considerably. Please ensure that your Year 11 child comes to school after exams.
7. **Support our school canteen** – Our canteen committee has been working hard on revamping the menu and ensuring that students have access to quality food at a good price. However, it has come to our attention that some students are ordering food (like Dominos Pizza and soft drink) to be delivered to the gates of the school. This is not only a breach of the green food policy, it also impacts on sales at the canteen. Please encourage your child to keep their business local and purchase from the P&C run canteen.
